## WHA'S PREPAREDNESS PREVENTS IMPACT FROM NATIONWIDE MICROSOFT OUTAGE

Recently, a global Microsoft outage, caused by a glitch in CrowdStrike software, affected numerous businesses, including airlines. However, the Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA) remained unaffected by this widespread disruption, thanks to the proactive approach taken by WHA's Information Technology (IT) department.

The Wilmington Housing Authority IT Team does not follow the common practice of auto-updating Windows, Apple, or Android devices. While auto-updates can ease IT workloads, they also carry significant risks by not allowing time for proper testing, which could result in system-wide issues like the recent outage. Instead, WHA IT tests and reviews updates weekly, deploying only those confirmed to be fully functional. This method, supported by patch management and mobile device management (MDM) software, ensures greater control and reliability.

Additionally, WHA does not use CrowdStrike for endpoint protection, a key factor in the current global issue. WHA credits its thorough research and the collaboration with its partners at Tech Solutions for the measures that successfully safeguarded the organization from this widespread disruption. By maintaining control over updates and deploying a multi-layered approach to security, WHA has avoided the problems that are currently paralyzing businesses worldwide. Thank you to WHA's IT Department for their wise decision making and partnerships.






## FREE ACCESS TO BOOKS


