Welcome to the Wilmington Housing Authority's (WHA) Quarterly Newsletter.

The WHA is the largest direct provider of affordable housing opportunities in the State of Delaware. We are committed to developing, providing, and managing safe and affordable housing for low-income families in the city of Wilmington.

During the third quarter, the Wilmington Housing Authority YouthBuild Program welcomed its first cohort of participants. Youth in the program began their work readiness and GED preparation planning. While in the program, the youth also got to participate in team building exercises and identify their career goals and aspirations. We are excited to watch them grow and excel in the program.

Division of Services for Aging and Adults with Physical Disabilities (DSAAPD) pilot has been well attended and expanded to a sixth WHA location. As of September, workshops are being hosted one per month at each location. Residents now have the opportunity to attend workshops at Lincoln Towers in addition to the original five locations.

IMANI VILLIAGE CELEBRATES ITS GRAND OPENING

On August 16, 2022, Imani Village celebrated the grand opening with a ribbon-cutting ceremony at the newly constructed community. Imani Village will provide families in the City of Wilmington with beautiful, energy efficient, and affordable housing in the community they love.

Nearly 200 people of the Riverside community attended the ceremony, which included elected officials from state, federal and local levels. This first phase of eight is an exciting and welcomed start to a total of 600 mix-income rental and for-sale homes.

Imani Village is the work of Wilmington Housing Authority's partnership with REACH Riverside (an organization of community leaders), Purpose Built Communities, and Penrose Development.

Residents started moving into Imani Village in July, which is located at 1400 Todds Ln, Wilmington, DE 19802. Sandra Honie was the first person to move in, and is ecstatic about her beautiful new home. The first phase of the project consists of 74 mixed-income rental apartments.

These homes range from one to four-bedroom units. Apartment availability is inclusive of the diverse needs of the community by offering units for seniors, veterans, individuals with disabilities and 15 units with no income restrictions. Twelve of the units are fully Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible, eight units are designated for residents with special needs, and all are Zero Energy Ready. In addition to enjoying their new homes, residents have access to a fully equipped Community Room allowing neighborhood engagement opportunities.

The project will also provide comprehensive social services onsite to further assist residents in achieving their goals.

STATEWIDE EMERGENCY REPAIR PROGRAM

Milford Housing Development Corporation (MHDC) is managing the Delaware State Housing Authority's Statewide Emergency Repair Program (SERP). The Statewide Emergency Repair Program provides assistance to eligible households for approved repairs related to emergency conditions threatening the safety of Delaware owner-occupied homes.

Qualifying repairs are for habitual living spaces. Acceptable repairs are as follows:

- Heating System (October - March)
- Plumbing (non-functional or leaking)
- Electrical (hazard exists or non-functional)
- Roof repair/replacement (active leaking into home)
- Major structural repairs
- Urgent accessibility modifications with Physician approval - grab bars, tub cut outs, ramps, etc.
- Other restrictions may apply

UTILITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LIHEAP)

Delaware has two components to LIHEAP for helping income eligible Delawareans during the winter months with their energy assistance needs.

FUEL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (FAP)

Fuel Assistance Program (FAP) provides help with home energy bills for both homeowners and renters from October 1st through March 31st. FAP grants for qualifying income eligible families can be used for electricity, natural gas, propane, wood, kerosene or coal.

CRISIS INTERVENTION PROGRAM (CIP)

Crisis intervention Program (CIP) is offered during winter months. Families participating in this program must provide proof of crisis (i.e., shut off notice, no money to pay or out of fuel in addition to income eligible to qualify.)

WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (WAP)

WAP helps income eligible Delaware renters and homeowners lower their energy bills through weather proofing and increasing the energy efficiency of their homes at NO COST. An assessment by a WAP professional will be completed to identify what enhancements, such as, weather stripping or insulation can be provided to reduce your energy bills.


