## THE WILMINGTON HOUSING AUTHORITY OFFERS AUTOMATED MESSAGING TO RESIDENTS

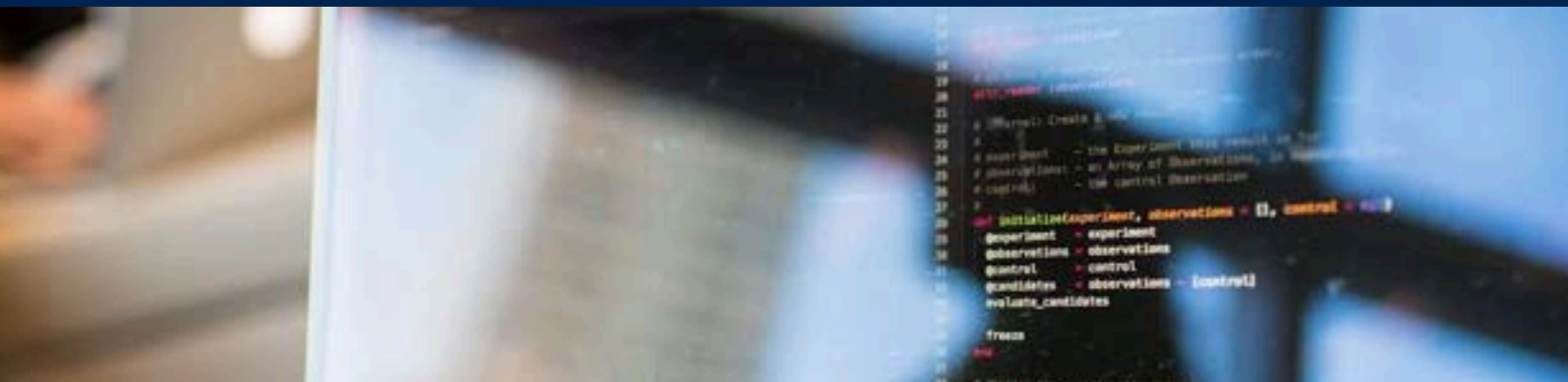
The Wilmington Housing Authority now provides automated text messages and phone calls to residents. These automated messages allow residents to receive updates, notices, and other resources in real time.

At the Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA), technology is more than a tool—it's a strategic asset. Guided by the mission to “empower the organization through innovative and reliable information technology solutions,” the WHA Information Technology (IT) Team plays a pivotal role in advancing our agency’s operations and resident services. Under the leadership of Chief Jessica Clarkson, this dedicated team—La-Don Walker, Ethan Moore, Ian Mengers, Gabriel Kaniecki, Jadon Walker, and Administrative Assistant Lucy Barbu—ensures that our systems run securely, efficiently, and with forward-thinking precision. Their work supports nearly every function of WHA, from tenant applications and compliance reporting to secure communication and maintenance management.

In recent years, the IT Team has led major infrastructure upgrades and digital transformations that have significantly improved how WHA operates. Projects include implementing Laserfiche for streamlined document management, deploying DialPad for cloud-based communications, and transitioning our network from COAX to fiber optics for faster, more reliable internet. They have also upgraded all staff equipment, introduced OOMA devices to enhance service equipment connectivity, and developed statistical reporting tools to improve customer response times. Several team members are currently pursuing degrees in Organizational Leadership at College Unbound, with the IT department providing the technological support needed for their success. From hosting agency-wide cybersecurity trainings to applying Six Sigma methodologies for process improvements, this team exemplifies innovation, adaptability, and a genuine commitment to WHA’s mission.

More than just a support function, WHA’s IT Department is a valued partner in driving excellence, equity, and access across our programs. Their collaborative spirit, problem-solving expertise, and community-minded approach make them an essential force behind WHA’s progress. ## WHA CELEBRATES CAREER ADVANCEMENT FOR LEAD ABATEMENT GRADUATES WITH JF BUILDS

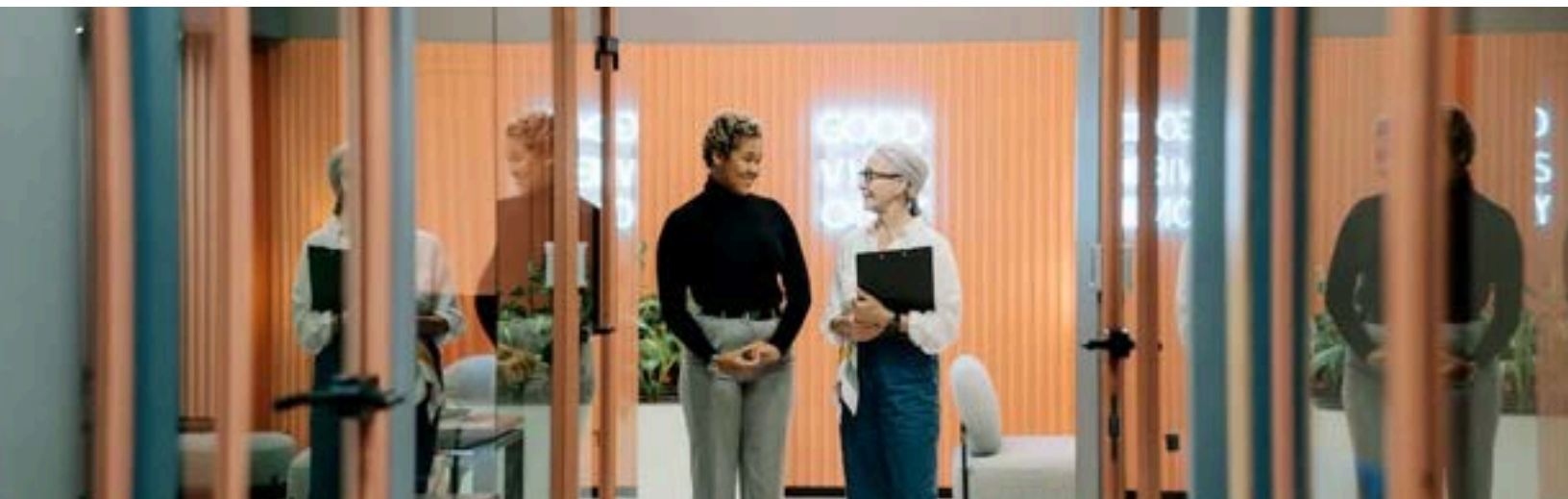

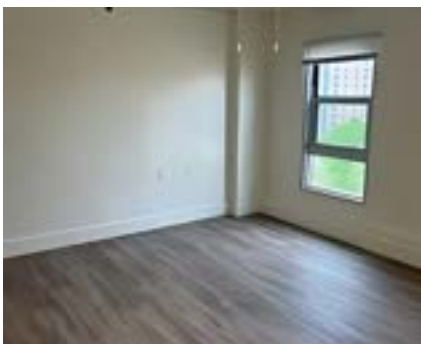

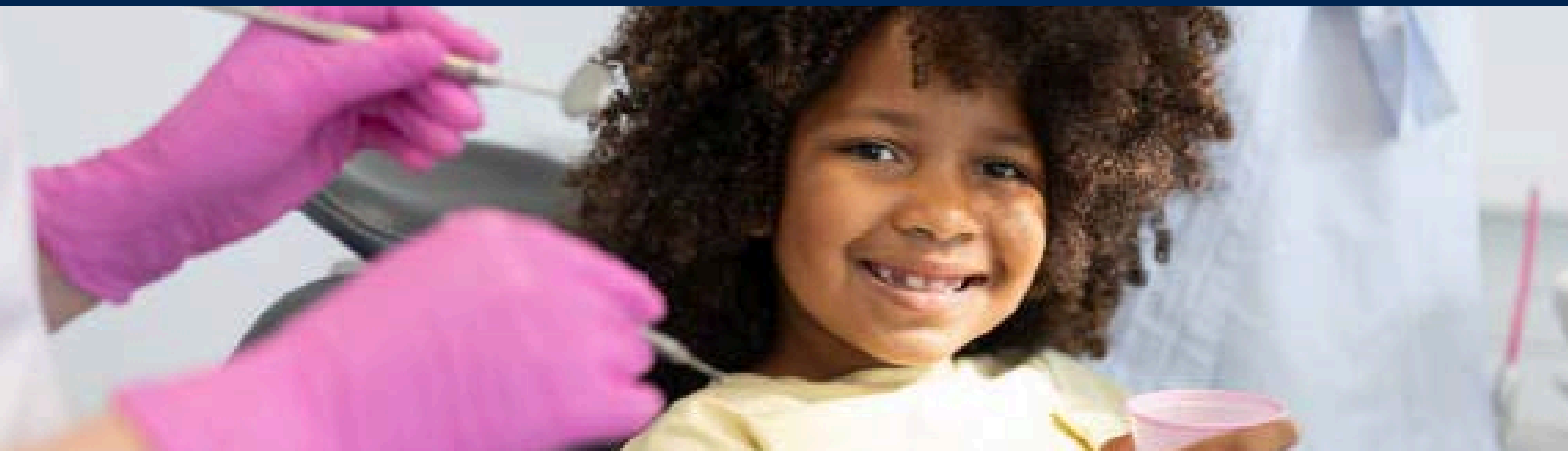


## ONE-STOP SHOP ENVISION CENTER HOMEBUYER'S WORKSHOPS
