WILMINGTON HOUSING AUTHORITY HAS A SOLAR FARM

The Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA), in collaboration with state and local leaders, opened the Southbridge Solar Park in 2018. Developed by Ecogy Energy, the 1.15-megawatt renewable energy project was built on the site of the former Southbridge Extension housing complex. As one of the largest privately financed solar projects serving public housing in the country, the installation generates clean energy while significantly reducing utility costs for WHA. The savings enable WHA to re-invest in the maintenance and improvement of affordable housing for residents. In addition to advancing environmental sustainability by reducing carbon emissions, the project demonstrates how previously unused land can be transformed into a valuable community asset that benefits both residents and the surrounding neighborhood.

Cynthia will continue to be available every Tuesday throughout the month of July from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. in the Elwyn Building Atrium (between the Lobby and Annex). This partnership reflects WHA's ongoing commitment to connecting residents, clients, and staff with valuable health resources that support overall well-being.

During these weekly outreach events, Cynthia is available to provide information and educational materials about breast health, the importance of early detection, mammograms, and available screening services. Visitors are encouraged to stop by with questions, learn more about preventive care, or obtain resources to support themselves or loved ones. No

appointment is necessary, and private conversations are available upon request to ensure a comfortable and confidential experience.

By bringing trusted healthcare professionals directly into the workplace, WHA and ChristianaCare are helping to reduce barriers to health education and increase awareness of lifesaving preventive services. This collaboration is another example of the strong partnerships that enhance the quality of life for those we serve while fostering healthier communities throughout Wilmington and beyond.

HOUSING LOCATOR SERVICES

The Delaware Affordable Housing Group (DAHG) is the non-profit affiliate to WHA. The Housing Locators on DAHG's Premier Rapid Housing Placement Team (PRHPT) had a stellar second quarter of 2026 with June's 26 being their second highest placement for 2026, PRHPT Trainer, Jennifer Harris had the highest number of placements for the month.

The team assisted 65 families in locating housing in the second quarter of 2026 and 129 total placements for the first half of 2026. During June, while most placements were WHA Housing Choice Voucher holders, one family was referred from Delaware State Housing Authority, two others were Veterans and four others were self-pay. Our team is committed to helping families identify affordable and safe housing statewide. All clients were pleased to have assistance in their journey.

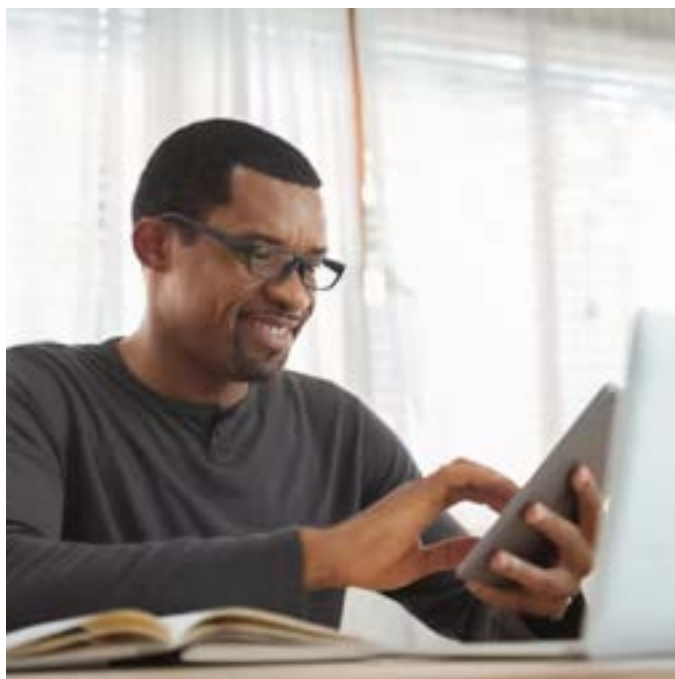


CRITICAL TIME INTERVENTION PROGRAM

- Adults (18+) returning from incarceration or treatment
- Individuals with opioid use disorder or high relapse/overdose risk
- High-risk individuals facing housing instability or limited support systems

UTILITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LIHEAP)

Delaware has two components to LIHEAP for helping income-eligible Delawareans during the winter months with their energy assistance needs. Call 302-654-9295 for LIHEAP assistance.

CRISIS INTERVENTION PROGRAM (CIP)

Crisis intervention Program (CIP) is available year-round and can be received in addition to the seasonal fuel assistance benefits. Families participating in this program must provide proof of crisis (i.e., are presently experiencing past due utility bills, shut off notice, no money to pay or out of fuel) in addition to income eligible to qualify.

SUMMER COOLING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SCAP)

SCAP is a flat supplemental benefit for summer cooling electric assistance. It is available to families who have previously applied for LIHEAP assistance, within the program year, aimed at offsetting the cost of electricity to cool their home during the summer months. This program also offers a single-room in-window air conditioner to households who can demonstrate a need. WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (WAP)

WAP helps income-eligible Delaware renters and homeowners lower their energy bills through weather proofing and increasing the energy efficiency of their homes at NO COST. An assessment by a WAP professional will be completed to identify what enhancements, such as weather stripping or insulation, can be provided to reduce your energy bills.

WATER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- Prevent disconnection of household water services
- Help reduce current household water bills
