## PROGRESS AND PROMISE: A TRANSFORMATIVE VISIT TO IMANI VILLAGE

In May 2024, Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA), in collaboration with The WRK Group and Pennrose, proudly hosted representatives from the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) at the Teen Warehouse in Wilmington. This visit highlighted the ongoing and future achievements of the Imani Village project, a newly constructed, multi-phase mixed-income family rental community in Wilmington's northeast Riverside neighborhood.

The event provided a platform for WHA and The WRK Group to showcase the progress at Imani Village, which is located at 1400 Todd's Lane in Wilmington, DE. HUD officials were given an in-depth tour of the community, which emphasized the holistic approach taken to support family self-sustainability within a welcoming and healthy environment. The tour included not only the newly built housing units but also the surrounding neighborhood, demonstrating the comprehensive revitalization efforts underway.

A focal point of the visit was the discussion of the \$50 million HUD grant awarded to Imani Village in 2023. The funding will allow WHA to expedite the project, ensuring the rapid development of new housing opportunities. HUD representatives were impressed with the progress made, particularly the quality of housing and amenities already benefiting residents, and the detailed plans for future phases. The visit underscored the successful partnership between WHA, The WRK Group, and Pennrose in creating a purpose-built community that addresses both housing needs and supportive services.

Ray Fitzgerald, Executive Director of WHA, provided valuable insights into the history and transformation of Riverside. He spoke about the area's journey and how Imani Village is now bringing hope and revitalization to long-standing residents. Fitzgerald highlighted that all original families are being given the opportunity to reside in Imani Village as new units are completed. He was pleased to report that phases I and II have been successfully finished, with families already enjoying their new homes. Efforts are ongoing to assist the relocation of the remaining families, with phase III.

The visit by HUD officials marks a milestone in the Imani Village project, reinforcing WHA's commitment to providing well-maintained, safe, and affordable housing. The collaboration with The WRK Group and Pennrose is a testament to the power of partnerships in creating thriving communities. As the project continues to unfold, Imani Village stands as a beacon of hope and renewal for Wilmington's Riverside community, ensuring a brighter future for its residents.
