# WHA STRENGTHENS COMMUNITY VOICE AT DELAWARE HOUSING TASK FORCE TOWN HALL

Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA) continues to play an active role in shaping housing policy and advancing collaborative solutions that strengthen communities across Delaware. As part of this ongoing commitment, WHA Executive Director, Ray Fitzgerald, recently presented at the Delaware Housing Department Task Force Town Hall, joining housing leaders, stakeholders, and policymakers in an important conversation about the future of housing coordination at the state level. The Town Hall provided an opportunity for local housing authorities to share practical insight, discuss community needs, and contribute to conversations focused on improving housing access and long-term stability for residents throughout Delaware.

During the presentation, WHA provided key input to help guide discussions on how a future Delaware Department of Housing could be structured and how local housing authorities might effectively coordinate with a centralized state agency. The presentation highlighted WHA's experience in administering housing programs, addressing local challenges, and building responsive systems that meet residents' needs. A central focus of the discussion was ensuring that any future framework supports collaboration while allowing local housing authorities to maintain the flexibility needed to respond to the unique needs of their communities. WHA also offered recommendations on how existing initiatives could align with broader statewide goals while preserving the effectiveness of locally driven programs.

WHA's participation reflects the agency's continued commitment to working through barriers, building strong partnerships, and contributing solutions that strengthen the housing ecosystem as a whole. By engaging in strategic discussions at the state level, WHA helps ensure that the voices of local communities remain part of the decision-making process. Through collaboration, innovation, and proactive leadership, WHA remains dedicated to advancing housing stability, supporting residents, and helping to build a stronger, more connected Delaware.

WHA's Lead Abatement Program plays a critical role in improving housing quality by addressing hazardous conditions and ensuring safer living environments for families throughout the community. By prioritizing health, safety, and preventative measures, the program supports WHA's broader mission of maintaining safe, well-managed housing while contributing to healthier neighborhoods across Wilmington.

Beyond its direct impact on housing safety, the Lead Abatement Program also serves as a valuable workforce development initiative that strengthens Wilmington's local economy. Participants receive hands-on training and paid work experience, equipping them with practical skills that prepare them for long-term employment opportunities. Graduates gain real-world experience through employment within WHA as well as through partnerships with community employers across the city, creating pathways to stable careers while supporting neighborhood revitalization efforts. Through this dual focus on safety and workforce development, WHA continues to demonstrate how innovative programming can produce meaningful outcomes for residents, families, and the broader community.

## A HEART FOR HOUSING

For the Premier Rapid Housing Placement Team (PRHPT) at Wilmington Housing Authority, the work goes far beyond daily responsibilities, it is a mission grounded in compassion, persistence, and partnership. Under the leadership of Supervisor Wayne Jefferson, the team approaches each referral with a shared commitment to helping Delaware residents secure safe and stable housing, recognizing that access to a safe home is often one of the most difficult basic needs to obtain. Through strong community partnerships and a resourceful, people-centered approach, the team works tirelessly to support individuals and families experiencing housing instability, offering guidance, advocacy, and hope during some of their most challenging moments.

One recent success story reflects the heart behind this work. After receiving a referral to assist a family facing homelessness, the team quickly mobilized resources, partnering with community organizations to secure temporary shelter, coordinating placement at the Hope Center, and maintaining support as the family worked toward stability. Despite setbacks and periods of lost communication, the team remained ready to help when the client reached out again after gaining employment and rebuilding savings. Through persistence and trusted landlord partnerships, the family was ultimately able to secure housing and sign a lease, marking a meaningful milestone on their journey toward stability. Stories like this illustrate how WHA's staff serve not just with professionalism, but with dedication and heart, helping families across Delaware move from crisis to opportunity.

## THE PREMIER RAPID HOUSING PLACEMENT TEAM SUCCESSFULLY FINDS HOMES FOR FAMILIES

In January 2026, our Premier Rapid Housing Placement Team successfully housed 27 families in safe, clean, and decent homes, despite the scarcity of affordable rental housing. Congratulations to Housing Placement Supervisor, Jennifer Harris with the highest placements for the month. January placements were primarily Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA) Housing Choice Vouchers as well as referral from Delaware State Housing Authority for a Delaware State Rental Assistance Program (SRAP) and three self-pay clients.

The Premier Rapid Housing Placement Team is dedicated to assisting individuals and families in Wilmington with housing placement. They offer services such as case management, barrier assistance, and rental navigation. 

# MCMULLEN SQUARE NEW CONSTRUCTION TOWNHOMES AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE
