DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT: HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER PROGRAM – CONNECTING FAMILIES TO OPPORTUNITY


At the Wilmington Housing Authority, the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program, formerly known as Section 8, plays a vital role in ensuring housing stability for low-income families, seniors, and individuals with disabilities throughout Wilmington. This program empowers participants to secure safe, decent, and affordable housing in the private rental market, offering the flexibility to choose where they live while receiving essential housing support. At the core of this work is a deeply committed team that approaches each day with professionalism, compassion, and a shared mission of service.

Led by Director of Housing, Sandi Rosmini, and Assistant Director/Leasing Coordinator, Annette Brown, the HCV Team includes Supervisors Jessica Baynard and Damon Adams, HCV Coordinator Kathi McGinnes, and a frontline of expert Housing Specialists: Waynna Dobson, Jessica Pacheco, Ra'Keerah Henry-Butler, Vashi'ti Baskerville, Carol Southall, Timitra Warren, Quan-Tia Busch, and Norris Teal. They are supported by Tunieza Henry, Confidential Executive Administrative Assistant, and Edwina Cottman, Front Desk Receptionist, who ensure every applicant and resident receives attentive, timely service. Together, they manage thousands of interactions each year, from initial applications and inspections to annual re-certifications and landlord support.

A recent major accomplishment of the team is WHA's successful collaboration with the four other housing authorities across Delaware to launch a centralized waiting list, which went live earlier this year. This new system allows applicants to apply to multiple housing authority waiting lists at once, or select specific locations, making the process more efficient, transparent, and accessible. This long-anticipated milestone reflects the HCV Team's forward-thinking approach and commitment to improving access to housing statewide.

What truly defines the HCV department is its strong culture of teamwork and mutual support. Staff consistently step up to help one another, especially during complex projects, and share a deep pride in the role they play within WHA. As one team member reflected, "What we enjoy most is the assistance we provide to the community." Their efforts make a real, lasting difference in the lives of Wilmington residents every single day. SPOTLIGHT ON WHA'S WELLNESS CHECKER PROGRAM: A YEAR OF CONNECTION AND CARE

Over the past year, the Wilmington Housing Authority's Wellness Checker Program has continued its mission of ensuring senior and disabled residents feel seen, supported, and cared for. Under the leadership of Supervisor Alicia Armstrong, the team streamlined operations by introducing a new reporting form that volunteers can easily complete on their tablets or phones. Between May 2024 and June 2025, volunteers made an impressive 7,879 wellness calls, demonstrating unwavering dedication to residents' wellbeing.

This year, 33 residents have been regularly receiving calls—just a slight change from last year's 36, reflecting the program's consistent commitment. Volunteers continue to deliver vital daily reminders about meals, hydration, medication, and exercise, while also providing meaningful companionship. As Alicia shared, the residents' appreciation speaks volumes about the impact of this work. Even when procedures like safety checks are necessary, the process reinforces that WHA is serious about resident well-being, with overwhelmingly positive acceptance.

The program's success has been driven by the volunteers' sense of care and reward in serving their neighbors. Alicia highlighted the personal growth and dedication shown by her team, managing diverse personalities and needs while keeping the program on track. Memorable moments abound—from residents expressing heartfelt thanks to simple but powerful reassurances like, "Don't think I don't want you to call me. I appreciate you checking on me." These interactions capture the essence of the program and its role in easing isolation and brightening days.

Looking ahead, WHA aims to expand the program by increasing both volunteer participation and the number of residents served. Alicia also envisions adding special touches such as annual fellowship gatherings and holiday or birthday greeting cards to strengthen these caring connections even further. The Wellness Checker Program stands as a testament to WHA's commitment to fostering a safer, healthier, and more connected community for our senior and disabled residents.

PATHWAYS TO HOMEOWNERSHIP: GUIDANCE FROM CARIN DRUMMOND. MERIDIAN BANK LENDER AND WHA COMMUNITY PARTNER



For Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA) and Delaware Affordable Housing Group (DAHG) clients, the journey to homeownership is about more than finding the right house—it's about building the knowledge, credit, and savings needed to succeed.

Carin, an experienced local lender and dedicated partner to WHA's Resident Services Department, offers guidance that demystifies the process and supports buyers at every stage.

MYTH BUSTING:

"A lot of first-time buyers think they need a large amount of money upfront," Carin explains. "But there are state, city, and county programs to help—even if you're not fully ready yet." Carin often guides clients to Delaware State Housing Authority (DSHA) programs, City of Wilmington or New Castle County grants, First Front Door funds, and Meridian's own options—all designed to support low-to-moderate income buyers.

FIRST THINGS FIRST:

"The first step isn't looking at houses," she says. "It's investing in yourself—your credit, your financial literacy, and your savings." Her approach is highly personal and supportive. "I'm not just doing a loan—I'm guiding and encouraging. I hold my clients' hands throughout the journey."

TIPS FOR BETTER CREDIT:

- 1. Keep balances at or below 18% of your limits.
- 2. Avoid paying for debt counseling companies—do your own research.
- 3. Don't get discouraged; credit improves with time if you're consistent.
- 4. Set up automatic minimum payments to avoid late fees.

COMMON PITFALLS TO AVOID:

- Applying for new credit during the loan process.
- Spending funds that should be saved for closing costs and moving expenses.

ADVICE FOR RENTERS PLANNING AHEAD:

"Budgeting is hard but even \$10 a week is a start. It shows lenders you're serious. It also covers real costs like moving trucks or essentials." She emphasizes self-discipline and being self-aware about spending habits as critical first steps.


MAINTAINING YOUR INVESTMENT:

"Have at least a six-month emergency fund. It's the best way to protect your home as a safe, secure, and valuable investment."

WHY JOIN WHA'S MONTHLY HOMEOWNER VIRTUAL MEETING?

"These sessions offer knowledge, wisdom, help, and encouragement," Carin says. "These opportunities didn't exist 10 years ago. Now, we can share tips straight from underwriters and help people really understand the process." WHA hosts these free virtual meetings on the second Thursday of every month at 2:00 PM. Our team is committed to helping families identify affordable and safe housing statewide. Most clients had housing vouchers, and all clients were pleased to have assistance in their journey.

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM SCAMS: STAY INFORMED, STAY SAFE

Wilmington Housing Authority urges residents to stay vigilant against increasingly deceptive scams targeting households in our community. One common tactic is the Compromised Card Scam, where fraudsters pose as bank representatives and claim your card has been compromised—then offer to "secure" your account by collecting the card in person, only to use it for theft. Another is the Rental Property Scam, involving fake property listings that request upfront payments for homes that either don't exist or are already occupied. Lastly, the Online Shopping Scam lures victims with low prices through fake websites or social media ads that never deliver the goods. To protect yourself, always verify phone calls using official contact numbers, pause if pressured to act quickly, and never pay with gift cards or provide personal information to unverified sources. If something feels off, talk it through with someone you trust. Scammers thrive on urgency and confusion—your best defense is awareness and caution.
