

Eligibility

Applicants must meet one of the following criteria:

- Be at least 62 years of age or older
- Be a person with a disability

How to Apply

WHA has partnered with AffordableHousing.com to manage the application process. Eligible individuals may apply online using any computer or mobile device, or by downloading a paper application.

Steps to Apply:

- 1. Visit https://delaware.affordablehousing.com/.
- 2. Review participating housing authorities and select "Apply Now" under Wilmington Housing Authority.
- 3. Sign in to access an existing account or sign up to create a new one.
- 4. Confirm your email address is correct.
- 5. After submission, applicants will receive an email notification with the status of their preliminary application.

The Low-Income Public Housing (LIPH) Department at Wilmington Housing Authority manages more than 1,500 rental units across Wilmington, ensuring families have access to safe, quality, and affordable housing. From leasing and move-ins to inspections, maintenance coordination, and lease compliance, this team supports residents throughout every stage of their housing journey. Their work goes far beyond property management, by collaborating with other WHA departments and community partners, the LIPH Team connects families with vital resources to help them succeed and thrive.

Whether it's welcoming a family into their first home, watching children grow up in WHA communities, or seeing multiple generations return for housing support, the LIPH Team takes pride in turning houses into real homes. WHA EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR RAY FITZGERALD JOINS STATEWIDE CONVERSATION ON HOUSING CHALLENGES

Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA) Executive Director, Ray Fitzgerald, served as a distinguished panelist at the Homelessness in Delaware Conference held on Thursday, August 14, 2025, in Newark, DE. The conference, hosted by the Center for Community Research and Service and the Institute of Public Administration, brought together leaders from across the state to discuss collaborative approaches to addressing housing instability. During the panel "Challenges in Securing Housing," discussion, Fitzgerald highlighted the comprehensive strategies WHA and its non-profit affiliate, Delaware Affordable Housing Group (DAHG), have implemented to assist Wilmington residents in locating, maintaining, and purchasing homes. He emphasized the value of crosssector partnerships among government agencies, private organizations, and community-based entities in expanding housing access and improving long-term stability for individuals and families.

Fitzgerald also discussed WHA and DAHG's continued commitment to innovation in housing initiatives, noting the success of DAHG's Premier Rapid Housing Placement Team (PRHPT)—a program that has helped over 300 households, many with Housing Choice Vouchers, secure housing over the past three years. Both organizations are expanding access not only to affordable rental housing but also to pathways for homeownership, helping residents prepare for and achieve full market-rate home purchases. Fitzgerald reinforced WHA's mission to provide safe, stable, and affordable housing while promoting self-sufficiency and community resilience. At Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA), we know that housing is just the beginning. Our Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) Program is designed to give residents the tools, resources, and support they need to achieve their goals and create brighter futures for themselves and their families.

The FSS Program links Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) and Low-Income Public Housing participants to a wide range of supportive services that help residents gain financial stability, pursue career opportunities, and work toward long-term self-sufficiency.

HOW THE FSS PROGRAM WORKS

When you enroll in FSS, you'll partner with a dedicated Service Coordinator who will help you create an action plan tailored to your goals. Along the way, you'll have access to services and resources such as:

- Job Readiness Support Resume assistance, interview prep, and soft skills training.
- Financial Empowerment Credit repair, money management strategies, and financial coaching.
- Education and Training Opportunities to continue your education or pursue certifications.
- Homeownership Preparation Guidance and resources for residents who aspire to purchase a home.
- Referrals to Community Services Access to a strong network of partner agencies and programs.

One of the most powerful features of the FSS Program is the escrow savings account. As your earned income increases, funds are set aside in this account—helping you build real savings as you work toward self-sufficiency. Upon successful completion of your FSS goals, you receive the escrow funds you've built.

In August 2025, our Premier Rapid Housing Placement Team successfully housed 23 families in safe, clean, and decent homes, despite the scarcity of affordable rental housing. Congratulations to Housing Placement Coordinator, Jennifer Harris with the highest placements for the month. August placements were primarily Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA) Housing Choice Vouchers as well as referrals from Delaware State Rental Assistance Program (SRAP), one Senior Management and one household had no voucher.

The Premier Rapid Housing Placement Team is dedicated to assisting individuals and families in Wilmington with housing placement. They offer services such as case management, barrier assistance, and rental navigation. By partnering with landlords, the team helps clients find suitable affordable housing options. These collaborations benefit landlords by aiding in tenant recruitment, ensuring property inspections meet safety standards, and facilitating secure monthly rental payments through a designated portal. 



FREE MENTAL HEALTH EMERGENCY SERVICES AVAILABLE FOR CHILDREN & YOUTH


