WHA is proud to celebrate the remarkable achievements of Angel Moody, who became a first-time homeowner during the third quarter of 2024 through WHA's homebuyer program. Angel's journey began with a determination to tackle credit card debt and change her financial habits. By working closely with financial coach partner of WHA, Marilyn Ramirez, from Stand By Me, she adopted a monthly budget and used tax returns to pay down bills. Angel's dedication led her to earn a Credit Repair Certificate by attending courses that helped boost her credit score and maintain financial stability.

Throughout her journey, Angel sought guidance from WHA's Nakia Wallace, a Resident Services Coordinator, who supported her every step of the way. Angel credits the Family Self-Sufficiency Program with giving her the tools and encouragement needed to reach her goals, saying, "I listed the steps I needed to take and followed the yellow brick road to achieve homeownership. My children are so happy, and I'm excited to purchase our first home."

Angel offers advice for others on the same path: "Take one step at a time. Join the Self-Sufficiency program, be persistent, and work hard. You'll be grateful for the sacrifices you make to reach your homeownership goal."

Nakia Wallace applauds Angel's determination and success, noting that she exceeded the program's requirements by achieving a credit score over 700 and securing additional financial assistance, including a \$15,000.00 First Front Door grant and Delaware State Housing Authority funding.



PRHPT HELPS TAMIKI WELDON SECURE STABLE HOUSING IN Q3 2024

The Wilmington Housing Authority's Premier Rapid Housing Placement Team (PRHPT) continues to demonstrate its effectiveness in helping residents secure stable housing. A standout success from the third quarter of 2024 is the story of Tamiki (Tami) Weldon, who found herself navigating the challenging path from homelessness to securing a safe and affordable home for her and her family, including her service dog and college student daughter.

Tami's housing search began in January 2023, and like many in Delaware, she faced significant obstacles. Despite temporary relief at



the New Castle County HOPE Center, her stay there ended before she could secure permanent housing. Tami's journey led her to temporary stays with family, friends, and even in her car, all while balancing the demands of work. It was during her stay at the HOPE Center that she first connected with Gary Mason, a dedicated member of the PRHPT.

After reconnecting with Gary in November 2023, Tami's situation began to improve. With Gary's hands-on support and consistent follow-ups, she was able to navigate the challenging rental market, which included landlords requesting three months' rent upfront. Gary identified a property that met her needs and worked diligently to connect her with the landlord. Tami was thrilled when the realtor selected her for the property, which is conveniently located just 10 minutes from her workplace.

Tami is now settled into a home that she says she "wouldn't trade for the world." She credits the PRHPT program and Gary's unwavering support as instrumental in her success. Gary not only helped her find a home but also ensured she had what she needed after the move, including furniture.

Tami's story is a testament to the transformative power of the PRHPT program. As Tami shared, "The PRHPT program is a blessing, and Gary was outstanding throughout the process. He is a gift."

This success highlights WHA's commitment to providing stable housing solutions for those in need and the critical role our dedicated team members play in making that possible.

Clients are referred to the team through several different sources, including WHA's Section 8 Team, community partners, residents transitioning from Riverside Family Development and other community members. Our team is committed to helping families identify affordable and safe housing statewide. Most clients had housing vouchers, and all clients were pleased to have assistance in their journey.
