EMPOWERING TRANSITIONS: YOUTHBUILD LAUNCHES NEW PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SOFT SKILLS PROGRAM

The Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA) YouthBuild program proudly introduces a new Professional Development soft skills component to its curriculum. Launched in October 2024, the curriculum focuses on preparing participants for job readiness by addressing critical soft skills essential for successful transitions into the workforce. Throughout the program, YouthBuild Case Managers and Job Developers provide coaching, with comprehensive clinical support from Dr. Cecilia Willis, the program's Clinical Therapist. In addition to the group sessions, Dr. Willis works with participants one-on-one sessions to provide guidance to help them navigate their job searches. This initiative aims to reinforce professional skills gained during YouthBuild and support participants' transition from WHA work experiences to external employment opportunities.

The Professional Development component consists of eight 45-minute group sessions, followed by individualized meetings that focus on job search progress and support through employment or graduation.

During the group sessions, participants review and reinforce foundational employment skills, including resumé refinement, workplace etiquette, appropriate attire, timeliness, and mock interviews. One-on-one meetings then provide personalized discussions on the challenges, barriers, and achievements encountered during job searches. Dr. Willis also addresses the participants' physical and mental well-being as they navigate these next steps. Recognizing that this transition can be daunting for those without prior support systems, this curriculum component serves as a structured, supportive bridge, empowering YouthBuild participants to confidently utilize their new certifications and skills for sustainable career success.

In October 2024, our Premier Rapid Housing Placement Team successfully housed 16 families in safe, clean, and decent homes, despite the scarcity of affordable rental housing. October were Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA) Housing Choice Vouchers, including six to assist families transitioning from WHA Riverside community.

The Premier Rapid Housing Placement Team is dedicated to assisting individuals and families in Wilmington with housing placement. They offer services such as case management, barrier assistance, and rental navigation.

By partnering with landlords, the team helps clients find suitable affordable housing options. These collaborations benefit landlords by aiding in tenant recruitment, ensuring property inspections meet safety standards, and facilitating secure monthly rental payments through a designated portal. 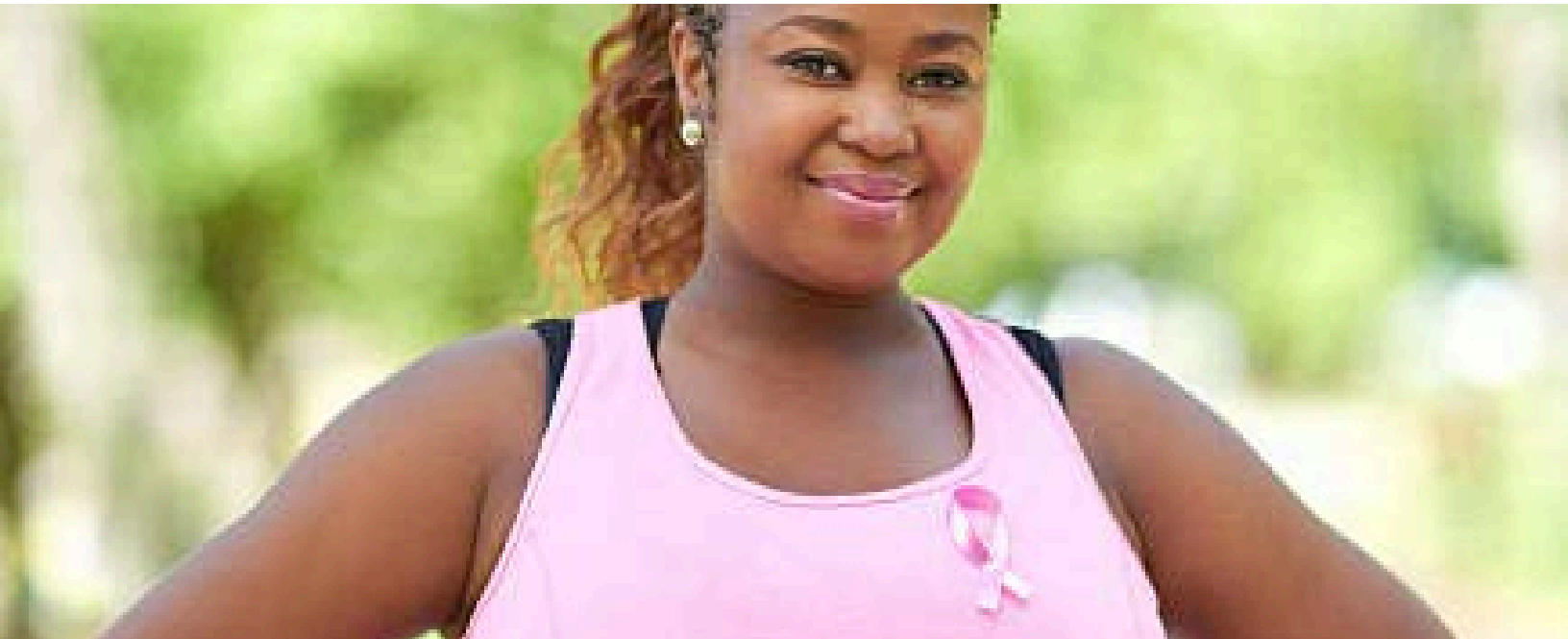
WILMINGTON HOUSING AUTHORITY EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT: NORRIS TEEL

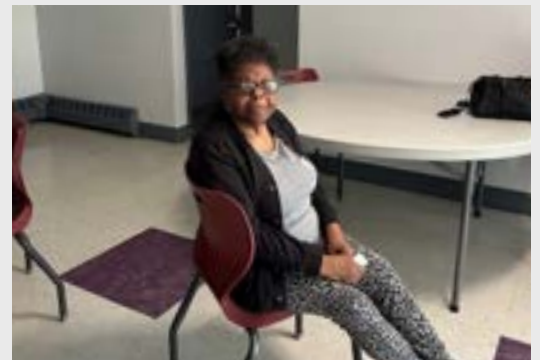

DIABETES PREVENTION PROGRAM

YMCA of Delaware offers a 16-week Diabetes Prevention Program. The program is covered by most insurance providers so there are no out-of-pocket costs. The self-pay fee for the year-long program is \$429.00. It is a 12-month program that starts with 16 weekly meetings covering nutrition, physical activity, overcoming stress, staying motivated, and more. Program goals include reducing body weight by 7% and gradually increasing physical activity to at least 150 minutes per week.

STRENGTHENING FAMILIES PROGRAM

Children and Families First offers the Strengthening Families Program (SFP). The program teaches practical skills to parents/caregivers and children. These 14-week hybrid (8 in-person sessions & 6 virtual) classes are held once per week. Classes are specific to age group of the identified child ranging from 5 to 17 years of age. BLOOD PRESSURE SELF MONITORING PROGRAM

The YMCA's Blood Pressure Self-Monitoring Program (BPSMP) supports adults with hypertension in lowering and managing their blood pressure. The four-month program focuses on practicing home self-monitoring of blood pressure readings and individualized nutrition education for better blood pressure management.

DELAWARE SCREENING FOR LIFE

Screening for Life provides payment for cancer screening tests to Delaware adults who qualify. Eligible individuals can receive:

- Office visits
- Mammograms and clinical breast exams
- Pap tests
- Prostate cancer screening tests recommended by your doctor
- Colorectal cancer screening tests recommended by your doctor
- Lung cancer screening tests, if recommended by your doctor and you meet criteria
- Health education
- Help with coordinating associated care

LUNG CANCER SCREENING PROGRAM

Current smokers 50 to 80 years of age or a smoker who quit within the last 15 years who smoked 20 pack years or higher should be screened for lung cancer. Pack years can be calculated by multiplying the number of cigarettes you smoked per day by the number of years you smoked.

Nurse Navigators can schedule cancer screenings and Screening for Life can help pay for screenings to those eligible.
