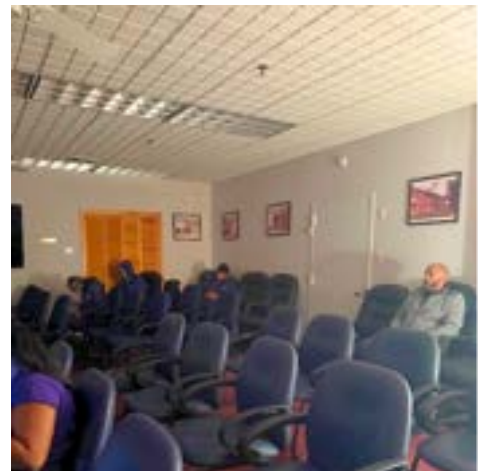

## SPOTLIGHT ON WHA'S RESIDENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT: EMPOWERING RESIDENTS FOR A BRIGHTER FUTURE

At Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA), we believe that housing is just the beginning—true success comes from equipping residents with the resources and support they need to thrive. The Resident Services Department is at the forefront of this mission, connecting residents to life-changing programs in workforce development, financial empowerment, homeownership, and wellness. Operating from the One Stop Shop (OSS) Envision Center at Crestview Apartments, Resident Services provides case management, referrals, and direct services that help residents take meaningful steps toward economic independence and self-sufficiency. Whether through the Low-Income Public Housing Resident Opportunity and Self-Sufficiency (LIPH ROSS) program, the Housing Choice Voucher Family Self-Sufficiency (HCV FSS) Program, or specialized wellness programs for seniors and disabled residents, WHA is committed to fostering growth, stability, and success for all residents.

Currently, Resident Services is actively recruiting participants for several key programs. Residents in the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program are encouraged to enroll in the Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) program, which offers workforce development training, job placement assistance, financial management services (credit repair, savings, budgeting),

education support, and homeownership resources. Participants in Low-Income Public Housing (LIPH) can enroll in the ROSS program, which provides similar services to help individuals and families reach their goals, as well as assist elderly and disabled individuals in aging in place. Additionally, WHA is enrolling elderly (50+) or disabled (18+) residents living alone in the Wellness Checker program, which provides regular wellness calls for added support. For elderly public housing residents (50+), there is also a special WHA partnership with the Wilmington Senior Center, offering access to vital senior services. These programs are completely free for eligible residents and, in some cases, even provide financial perks, such as savings incentives for participants in the HCV FSS program.

The Resident Services team, led by Resident Services Chief Irmina E. Brown-Williams, consists of skilled and dedicated professionals eager to assist residents in achieving their goals. Their expertise and commitment ensure that every resident has the support they need to build a happier, healthier, and more productive life. Whether you're looking for career advancement, financial stability, homeownership, or wellness support, these programs are here for you—at no cost.
